

Objectives

The learner will be able to

1. Select items and place them in the folder
2. Choose the method that they want to obtain the citations (print, save, email) and perform it
3. Determine if the full-text of an item are available
4. Explain how items not owned locally can be obtained.

Scenario

- I have a paper to write for Professional Socialization class so I am looking for material about Florence Nightingale. I have already found some books in the library, but I need to locate some journal articles.

Search Process

STEP 1: Take your information need and create a search statement about it.

I need articles about Florence Nightingale.

STEP 2: Identify the important concepts in your search

Articles about Florence Nightingale.

STEP 3: Try a key word Search for Florence Nightingale from the "Advanced Search" screen.

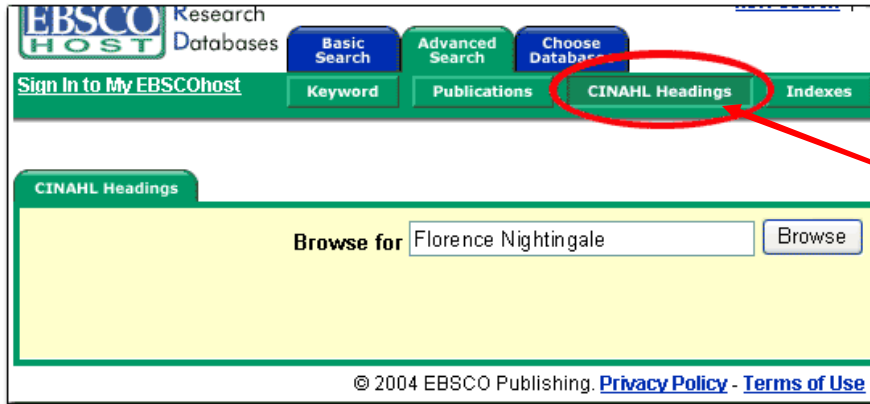

Some of the citations are about Florence Nightingale, but many of them are not about her. Why did they show up? When you do a keyword search, the search engine searches the entire citation for the words. The words "Florence Nightingale" are somewhere in each record. An example is below.

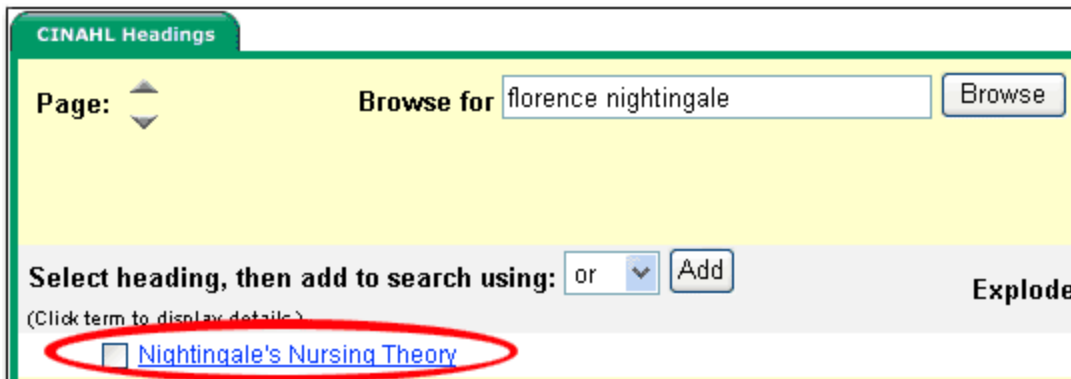

The key words "Florence Nightingale" are in the Author Affiliation field. That is not what we are searching for. How can the records that are not about Florence Nightingale be eliminated? Let's do a Subject Heading search. A subject heading of Florence Nightingale brings up "Nightingale's Nursing Theory". Again this is not what we are searching for.



Click on the CINAHL Headings button, and type "Florence Nightingale" in the Browse for box. Then click the Browse button.

Let's do a Subject Heading search. A subject heading of Florence Nightingale brings up "Nightingale's Nursing Theory". Again this is not what we are searching for.



The name does not exist as a subject heading. What is Florence Nightingale? She was a historical person or leader, founder of nursing, leader in nursing. Let's find a subject heading that contains those ideas.

A subject-heading search of "historical person" did not retrieve useful subject headings.

None of the Qualify Subheadings are related to our general search, so do not select any.



Virginia Henderson: Reflections on a twentieth century Florence Nightingale

On rare occasions, perhaps every century or two, a leader of significant merit emerges. That leader's vision, energy, leadership, insight, and exceptional skills launch improvement and change. Although nursing has many leaders, Virginia Averel Henderson was one of those rare "leaders of leaders." She was an exceptional woman who elevated nursing from its nineteenth century handmaiden position to one in which professionals use critical thinking and independent action. She used scientific knowledge to generate support systems for practice changes. She laid the foundation for modern nursing and led us to the position of nobility that our profession is in today. Virginia Henderson, often called the Florence Nightingale of America, was one of the world's greatest nursing leaders. She lived a rich and full life for 96 years and continues to be a source of love and inspiration beyond her death on March 19, 1996.

You will not find every article in electronic format nor will the library own every journal. The SFX system is not foolproof and sometimes a link to another database will be a dead end.
